1 Ojota

Ojota used to be a military settlement in the late 18th century and soldiers practised their shooting there. The area had several gun firing spots and became known as "Oju Ota" in Yoruba which means "Bullet spots". It later metamorphosed into Ojota which it is called now.

2. Abule Egba

This area is on the outskirts of Lagos and got its name from the early settlers who were Egba people from Abeokuta. The area was first called "Abule awon egba" in Yoruba, which means "Village of Egba people". It later became "Abule Egba".

3. Apongbon

Apongbon is one of Lagos' most popular markets, and it's also quite close to the popular Oke-Arin market. It got its name from the then acting governor of the Lagos colony, William McCoskry, who had a Red Beard. The Yorubas who couldn't pronounce the colonial governor's name decided to describe him by his red beard and started calling him "Oyinbo to pon ni agbon" (Apon l'agbon) meaning a red-bearded man. It later became Apongbon.

4. Magodo

Magodo is now a posh area, but in the past, it used to be sacred land. The residents had a lot of taboos and one of them was to avoid using mortars and pestles, "Ma gun odo" which means "Don't pound it". It later became Magodo

5. Epetedo

Epe is named after the early settlers who were Epe traders. The area became dominated by the Epes and they still trade there until today.

6. Ebute-Metta

Ebute-Metta is one of the earliest harbour docks where British ships berthed at. It was a hub for trade and commerce in colonial times. Ebute-Metta is a fusion of the words "Ebute"

which means the seaside in Yoruba, and "Metta" which means three. The three shores are Iddo, Otto and Oko baba.

7. Broad street

Broad street used to be one of the longest and widest streets in the city. It got its name from its broadness. However, Broad Street was later changed to Yakubu Gowon Street but later changed back to Broad street when Gowon was accused of participating the coup that led to the death of Murtala Ramat Mohammed.

8. Agidingbi

The British Naval forces invaded Lagos in 1885 under the pretext of stopping slavery and human sacrifice. The noise their canon made was really loud, and the sound was heard round the streets of Lagos Island. The people described the sound as "A gidi n gbinnn". Which means a loud groundbreaking noise. The name Agidingbi was borne out of this.

9. Victoria Island

Victoria Island was also a major hub for commerce and British ships berthed there often. It's named after Queen Victoria of England who was Queen from 1837-1901.

10. Ikeja

Ikeja, the capital of Lagos, is actually an abbreviation for "Ikorodu and Epe Joint Administration", IKEJA. It was coined by the colonial masters for ease of administration."

SUNDAY CLASS STUDY

MY SPIRITUAL HEALTH TEST

Text: 2 Cor 13:5

Introduction: It is an advantage to be able to examine oneself. It is far better than exposing oneself to the scrutiny of others, and the benefits are much. Doing occasional health checks is beneficial to the body and so true spiritually. Here are three standards to be applied to get accurate results on where you belong with our Lord Jesus Christ.

1. What did my prayer and prayer life sound like? (Phil 1:9-10) - The difference between gospel-centered prayers and self-centered prayers is their focus. If our prayers sound a lot like us asking God to protect us, provide for us, attack our enemies, or overcome our current life situation - and if these requests are ends unto themselves - then we are most likely praying self-centered prayers. Of course, we can and should pray for these things because God cares about us. But our faith is not simply self-serving. Gospel-centered prayers are the kinds of prayers that we need to have for our families, our friends, our churches, and our own lives. Our prayers need to be far more gospel-centered and far less self-centered.

2. Is there a sin I currently struggle with? (Rom 6:14) - Part of the sanctification

process is Jesus working in our lives and hearts to make us more like him. He was sinless and blameless. The more we walk with Jesus, the more we see the work of sanctification in us. Our goal is that those sins that we once struggled with no longer tempt us in the slightest. Recognize that overcoming the sin in your life is crucial because it means you are continuously struggling with pleasing God. However, when the work of sanctification is fully matured, sin will no longer dominate us.

3. Are people testifying to my standing with Jesus? (Matt 5:16) - Growing in the knowledge and truth of God is a true blessing. As your eyes are being opened and the truth is being revealed. However, we must be cautious in how we declare these truths. Of course, we should never waiver on the truth. Our goal should not only educate the world on everything they're doing wrong. It should also be to point them to Jesus through our Christian living.

Devotion TODAY With Pastor Christie



Monday's Path: Jer 38:6 So they took Jeremiah and cast him into the dungeon of Malchiah the king's son, which was in the court of the prison, and they let Jeremiah down with ropes. And in the dungeon there was no water, but mire. So Jeremiah sank in the mire.

PathWay: The prophet Jeremiah faced pressure to compromise. Refusing to yield, he was let down into a deep hole filled with mud. Officials wanted to silence him, but he remained faithful and obedient to God. Likewise, you may face pressure to compromise your faith. Yet, no matter the opposition, stay faithful to God. Trust in Him. Don't allow circumstances or the reactions of others to influence you.

*O Lord, help me stay true to you in Jesus' name; PRAY!

Tuesday's Path: Jer 43:2 that Azariah the son of Hoshai, Johanan the son of Kareah, and all the proud men spoke, saying to Jeremiah, "You speak falsely! The LORD our God has not sent you to say, 'Do not go to Egypt to dwell there.'"

PathWay: Despite appearing spiritual, they weren't interested in what God wanted. They just wanted Him to endorse their desires. They hoped He would encourage them to go to Egypt. Instead, Jeremiah told them God wanted them to stay in Israel. This was not what they wanted to hear. Instead of accepting this as God's direction, they concluded Jeremiah was lying. Today, ask yourself if you want to hear from God and not force your will on Him.

*O Lord, help me trade my will for yours in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Wednesday's Path: Jer 48:40 For thus says the LORD: "Behold, one shall fly like an eagle, And spread his wings over Moab.

PathWay: The Bible described a situation when Moab became confident in themselves, trusting their abilities and strongholds. They were not humble, vigilant, or prepared to face their enemies but had "become arrogant toward the Lord." As a result, even their mighty men could not stand against the attacks.

*O Lord, help me not be haughty before you in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Thursday's Path: Jer 49:33 "Hazor shall be a dwelling for jackals, a desolation forever; No one shall reside there, Nor son of man dwell in it."

PathWay: Throughout history, many nations, organizations, and people have become like Hazor – confident, sure of their strength, and trusting in their power and ability. Many today are just like this.

But God promises that eventually, in every kingdom, every person will be humbled before Him. Learn from what happened to Hazor. Remember, "Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, so that He may exalt you at the proper time" (1 Peter 5:6).

*O Lord, help me be humble more before you in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Friday's Path: Jer 51:58 Thus says the LORD of hosts: "The broad walls of Babylon shall be utterly broken, And her high gates shall be burned with fire; The people will labor in vain, And the nations, because of the fire; And they shall be weary."

PathWay: Babylon was a marvel of the ancient world, a masterpiece of design with magnificent and logically laid-out streets. Babylon seemed utterly secure. One scholar described how Nebuchadnezzar's engineers "constructed the great chain of fortifications which seemed to make Babylon impregnable" with walls 56 miles in length, 335 feet high, and 85 feet thick! Yet God knew these defenses eventually would fail, that Babylon's broad wall would "be completely demolished."

*O Lord, don't let me be too big before you in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Saturday's Path: Ps 138:8 The LORD will perfect that which concerns me; Your mercy, O LORD, endures forever; Do not forsake the works of Your hands.

PathWay: It can seem natural to have our ideas, to make decisions we think will be best, to form opinions, and to assume we understand God's purposes. Approaching issues like these, at times, David made decisions based on his subjective understanding. Eventually, he realized that he needed to trust God, that He always knows what's best. God was constantly shaping David's life, often in ways David might not understand. The Bible makes it clear: God sees beyond our temporary situations. He constantly chisels away at our character
