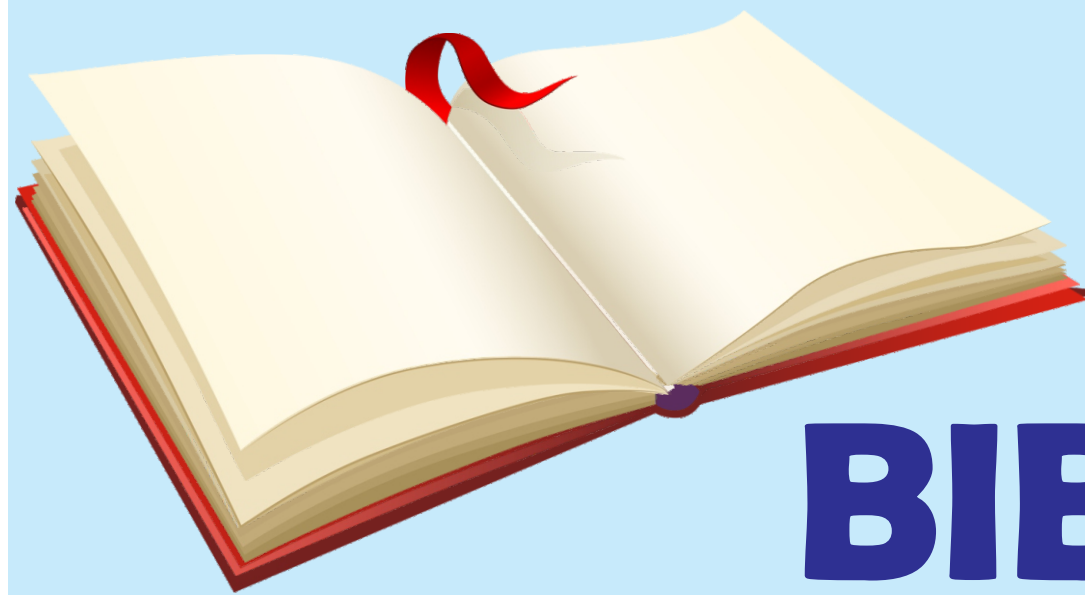

CAN Everyone SING?

Do you believe that everyone can sing?" Does any and everyone who has a voice possess the ability to sing a song? This question is well worth investigating because it has such a bearing on our worship and spiritual well-being.

The Bible says, "Speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord, giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eph. 5:19-20). It is a well-established fact that singing is part of

our worship of God. But time and time again, we hear some say, "Brother, you don't want me to sing to you; I couldn't carry a tune if I put a bucket on my head!" Then others will say, "I don't sing out loud during the worship because I don't have the ability, but I make melody in my heart." The American humorist Charles Farrar Browne, who was popular in the mid-1800s, said, "I am saddest when I sing. So are those who hear me." However, we must ask, "Why would God demand we do something that everyone can't do?"

The following excerpt is from the Columbia Encyclopedia: "Not only is the voice the principal means of human communication, but it was undoubtedly the first musical instrument. The instrument is within the performer, the condition of the vocal apparatus, and thus the quality of the voice, is strictly dependent on the physical and mental condition of the singer.

Since the vocal impulse cannot actually be described, the teacher's task is to provide the pupil with concepts, usually systematized into a vocal "method," that will free the vocal apparatus from restrictive tensions and

lead ultimately to the complete coordination of all the faculties involved."

Surprising, there is an absence of articles or explanations on why people have an inability to sing. It is true that some natural ability comes into play, and some of us don't have the vocal range that others have, but it would seem to reason that development of your singing voice is no different than learning to ride a bike, play tennis, or shoot a gun. It just takes practice.

Can everyone sing? Yes, if you have the ability to speak, you also have the ability to sing a song. Isn't that exciting? Isn't it comforting to know that God hasn't placed a command upon us that we all can't comply with? I want to encourage you to sing in our worship together. You'll receive such a blessing while actively participating in the worship of our Heavenly Father. You can now comply with the Psalmist when he said, I will declare Your name to my brethren, in the midst of the assembly, I will sing praise to You." (Psa. 22:22; Heb. 2:12)

SUNDAY CLASS STUDY AN EXAMINED LIFE

Text: 2 Corinthians 13:5
Introduction: One life God wants us to have is a life we keep examining daily to ascertain whether we are in the faith. The reason is that the line between good and evil, righteousness and unrighteousness, can be so thin at times that we might not realize that we have left God. Therefore, our life ought to be an examined life because the examined life will be a life with purpose, values, and faith. How are these explained?

1. Purpose (1 Cor 10:31) - The examined life is a life with true purpose. One must reason beyond the merely physical and realize that the true purpose of life is in the spiritual. What is that purpose? Our ultimate purpose in life is to glorify God. However, what does it mean to glorify God? It means to do everything according to the will of God. Are you living your life to the glory of God or to please your desire? You must live an examined life!

2. Values (Matt 16:26) - The examined life is a life with true values. "What matters most to us?" is a question that will go unanswered if we do not examine our lives. Worse yet, if we do not examine

deeply enough, that is, if we think that the answer lies in the realm of the physical and not the spiritual, then we will answer the question wrongly. Further, if our life purpose is wrong, our values will be wrong as well. It is easy to value things that are more concerned with the physical than the spiritual. However, if our purpose is right, the right values will be built around it, which are the things of God only.

3. Faith (Rom 1:28-31) - The examined life is a life with faith. "In whom should we put our trust?" will be a question we are willing to answer easily without reservation. We should be able to affirm that our trust is in God and Him only no matter what, or come what may. So, let us resolve to examine our lives, for the unexamined life is not worth living.

NOTE: You must be willing to live an examined life so your life will be worth it.

Monday's Path: Who is wise? Let him understand these things. Who is prudent? Let him know them. For the ways of the LORD are right; The righteous walk in them, But transgressors stumble in them.

Pathway: Putting your faith into action is the key message of the last verse in Hosea's book. This prophet warned that it wasn't enough to hear prophecies or read God's Word. We need to put His words into practice. How do you react to "the ways of the Lord"? Are you letting the world shape your thoughts, or have you dedicated your life to obeying God? Remember that His ways "are right." Walk in them.

*O Lord, let me understand your ways in Jesus' name; PRAY!

Tuesday's Path: Matt 11:29 "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

Pathway: Our world is filled with pressures: the constant threat of wars and violence, bills to be paid, decisions to be made, debt, disease, divisions, and conflict. We are urged to work hard, but that can lead to increased worry and stress. As we read the Bible, the words of Jesus can seem unrealistic. He says all we need to do is come to Him. He promises to give us rest. He offers to take our burdens away and give us peace and meaning. He will provide joy and fulfillment. How simple!

*O Lord, I trade my yoke with yours today in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Wednesday's Path: Luke 8:15 "But the ones that fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, keep it and bear fruit with patience.

Pathway: The parable of the sower is told in three of the Gospels. Each of these accounts explains why we must sow seeds to reap a harvest, but only Luke uses the phrase "bear fruit with patience." His account reminds us that "patience" is important to bearing fruit. Ask God to help you continue to believe His promises and put them into practice. Be steadfast in every situation.

*O Lord, deposit in me the spirit of patience in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Thursday's Path: Joel 1:2 Hear this, you elders, And give ear, all you inhabitants of the land! Has anything like this happened in your days, Or even in the days of your fathers?

Pathway: As Joel asked of his readers, we need to look around and see the impact of godlessness. Then we will see what

happens when people reject God and deny His Word. Finally, we will see what happens when sin is accepted. We, too, need a wake-up call. Recognize the need to change and repent of our sins. Pray and seek God's face, humble ourselves before Him, and cry for His forgiveness and mercy.

*O Lord, help me stay on the path of righteousness in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Friday's Path: Joel 2:28 "And it shall come to pass afterward That I will pour out My Spirit on all flesh; Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, Your old men shall dream dreams, Your young men shall see visions.

Pathway: These can be extraordinary days filled with anticipation for those who truly know God. Nonbelievers may see uncertainty, but Christians see prophecy being fulfilled. Conditions can seem unsettling, but Christians see God pouring out His Spirit, reminding us of His sovereign control and His plans, which have been fixed since the beginning of time. We are seeing the fulfillment of Joel's prophecy about a day when God will pour out His Spirit on all flesh in a time of unprecedented evangelism: Ask God to give you a new revelation of His Spirit and fill you anew.

*O Lord, give me new revelations of your spirit in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Saturday's Path: Hos 13:14 "I will ransom them from the power of the grave; I will redeem them from Death. O Death, I will be your plagues! O Grave, I will be your destruction! Pity is hidden from My eyes.

Pathway: Hundreds of years before Jesus' earthly ministry, the prophet Hosea realized that all people live in the shadow of Death. Because it is inevitable and final, Death creates a sense of hopelessness. Its impact has a "sting" no one can escape. Through prophecy, Hosea foretold that a time would come when Death would be defeated, and its sting would disappear. You can celebrate! Jesus died for you, and He rose again. Through Him, you are free from the sting of Death. Through Him, you can live in victory.

*O Lord, I praise you for your Death so I might live in Jesus' name.
