Like a Thief

One of life's necessary evils is that of physical security. Businesses can spend between \$1,000 and \$10,000 for a security system in addition to a \$300 monthly fee to help deter theft. The average homeowner may spend \$500 for a system with a \$50 monthly fee. We put locks, bolts, bars, and video doorbells on our houses in an attempt to prevent thieves from stealing our stuff. Then there is the threat of electronic and identity theft we have to guard against. Almost every vehicle is equipped with door locks and an alarm. Even with all of these precautions, statistics say that there is a break-in every 26 seconds for a total of 2.5 million burglaries per year in the US. The conclusion? It's very, very difficult to predict when a thief will strike. The Lord has always known this about the thief, and it's no wonder that He used the metaphor to describe Christ's second coming and the end of the world. Jesus said, "But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, but My Father only. (Matthew 24:36-44). He went on to say if the master of the house knew when the thief was coming, he would have watched and not allowed his house to be broken into (v.43) and concluded by telling His

disciples, "Therefore you also be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect." (v. 44).

The thief will take advantage of us when we become lax in our watching.

God tells us to always be ready and watchful for the coming of the Lord. Paul warned the Thessalonian church by saying, "Therefore let us not sleep, as others do, but let us watch and be sober. (1 Thessalonians 5:6) Because we have faith, love, and the hope of salvation, we can watch with much anticipation for that Great Day when Jesus comes back to bring us to Himself (John 14:1-4). With the wonderful expectation of Christ's return, we can be encouraged, comforted, and built up.

SUNDAY CLASS STUDY

THE ART OF TAKING OPPORTUNITIES

Text: Gal 6:10

Introduction: It is important to know that to excel in the world, you must take advantage of the opportunities before you and make something of them. In fact, it is a well-established fact that the future belongs to those who see possibilities before they become obvious. See, the ability to see opportunities is the key to success. What are the principles involved in taking opportunities, or better still, how do we master the art of taking opportunities?

1. We need the ability to see possibilities (Heb 11:15) - Unfortunately, many can't see opportunity because it is disguised as hard work. At times, it is so hidden we can confuse it as an impossibility. However, you will easily identify opportunities when you are not afraid to take your issues seriously and are ready to go out of your comfort zone. Doing this will make you see further and invite God into your future just because you have a clear vision of the future.

2. We need to be willing to risk failure (Phil 4:13) - As discussed earlier,

opportunities will elude us if we see failure as bad. See! Failure is part of the process and one step close to success. Not being successful on the first try does not make you a failure. It only gives you that room to try again. An old saying says, "Can't, never could do nothing." To excel, you must eliminate negative thinking and attitudes because going for it is all that faith is about.

3. We must be willing to sacrifice for something greater (Phil 2:8; Heb 12:2) - Note that there is always something greater before us all. However, the willingness to sacrifice money, time, and sleep is the difference between those who take an opportunity and those who don't. Developing the ability to make an effort with zeal and determination whenever an opportunity arises will separate you from the natural into the supernatural of God.

Monday's Path: Gen 25:8 Then Abraham breathed his last and died in a good old age, an old man and full of years, and was gathered to his people.

Pathway: How did Abraham become so satisfied? When Abraham made mistakes, he allowed God to correct him. When given a choice between accumulating wealth or following God, Abraham chose to follow God. Most importantly, he learned to walk by faith (Heb 11:8-10), trusting God to meet and direct his needs. If you want maximum satisfaction, seek to follow Abraham's example.

Tuesday's Path: Num 6:25 The LORD make His face shine upon you, And be gracious to you;

Pathway: The Hebrew word here demonstrates how much God wanted to bless and be merciful to them. It was as if He were pleading with them to believe Him, to realize just how much He wanted to help them. This prayer expresses God's desire for you. No matter what you face, you do not have to be discouraged, afraid, worried, or anxious. May these words help you realize how much He wants to bless and keep you.

Wednesday's Path: Psa 150:6 Let everything that has breath praise the LORD. Praise the LORD!

Pathway: The psalmist simply had one message: a command for everything and everyone to praise God. If we have breath, we are to praise Him. Praise is to be a lifestyle, a response to any condition. Praise is appropriate any time, day or night, whether we feel like it. Praise Him because of all we owe Him, all He has done, and His promises for the future. Regardless of what is going on in the world or your life, spend time praising God.

***O Lord, I praise God today for all I owe Him in Jesus' name. PRAY!**

Thursday's Path: 1 Tim 4:7 But reject profane and old wives'

fables, and exercise yourself toward godliness.

Pathway: Training is central to being a soldier, but it's also vital to the Christian life. To be equipped for spiritual warfare, to understand our enemies, and to be prepared, we must learn how to be victorious. Like the study of British leaders, the Bible urges us to be readers. Then we may know the Word and practice the insights we find there. We must seek God's help to be prepared.

***O Lord, make me ready each day to live my life for you in Jesus' name. PRAY!**

Friday's Path: Amos 3:7 Surely the Lord GOD does nothing, Unless He reveals His secret to His servants the prophets.

Pathway: Who are God's servants today? They are people who develop an intimate relationship with Him, listen to Him, fill their minds with His Word, are sensitive to His voice, and are ready to do what He asks. These are people to whom God reveals His secrets. These are His trusted servants. Seek to develop a more intimate relationship with God.

***O Lord, help me to be more intimate with you in Jesus' name. PRAY!**

Saturday's Path: Amos 4:6 "Also I gave you cleanness of teeth in all your cities. And lack of bread in all your places; Yet you have not returned to Me," Says the LORD.

Pathway: Throughout the chapter, we feel His love and desire to bless His people. It pained Him to allow them to experience problems. Yet they continued to go their own way and refused to return. God still desires to bless us. If we have drifted away, He calls us to return. If we have sinned, He calls us to repent. If we need direction, He calls us to seek Him.
