THE SIGNS OF MATTHEW 24

Sam Adeosun's



What about the signs of Matthew 24? This is what it all mean according to the submission of Raymond Sieg, a Bible teacher and preacher. Enjoy:

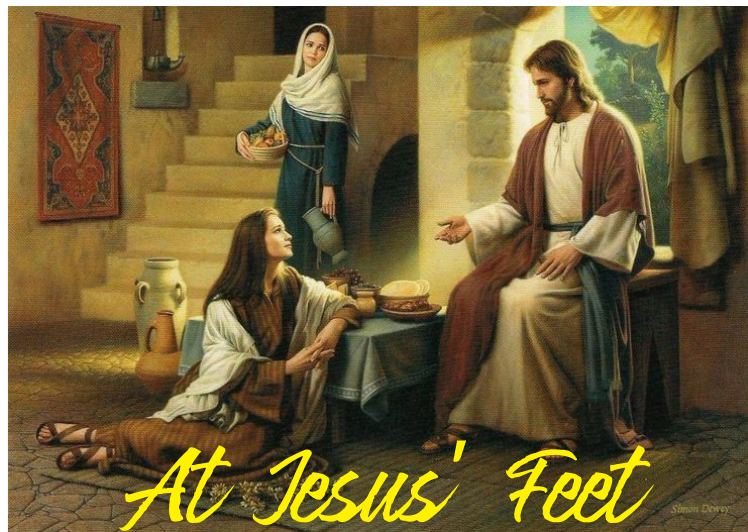
In Matthew 24:1-35, Jesus talked about a number of disturbing signs that would occur in the future. For example, He said that His followers would "hear of wars and rumors of wars" (vs.6). He also mentioned conflicts between nations and king-doms, as well as "famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes, in divers places" (vs.7). Although these signs are often applied to the Lord's return, Jesus related them to the occasion when the Jewish temple in Jerusalem would be destroyed.

Beginning at Matthew 24:36 and continuing through chapter 25, Jesus did talk about His return. As He discussed His return He had this to say: "But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only" (Matthew 24:36). Did you hear what the Lord said? He declared that no man or angel knows the time of His return. Only the Father knows. Because no one knows when Jesus will return, we must listen to the instructions that He gave. "Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come" (Matthew 24:42). "Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man

cometh" (Matthew 24:44). "Watch therefore, for ye know neither the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh" (Matthew 25:13). It is imperative that we follow these instructions because, when Jesus returns, "the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up" (2 Peter 3:10).

There will be no signs leading up to the Lord's return. Two inspired apostles, Paul and Peter, stated that the day of the Lord will arrive "as a thief in the night" (1 Thessalonians 5:2; 2 Peter 3:10). In other words, the Lord's return will be sudden and unexpected. So, when you hear of natural disasters such as hurricanes, tornadoes, flooding, forest fires, and volcanoes erupting, and when you hear of conflicts throughout the world, do not be alarmed. Such things do not mean that Christ is about to return.

The Lord wants us to get ready for His return by obeying the Gospel. He wants us to stay ready for His return by remaining faithful to Him. By being prepared we can actually look forward to the Lord's return, and we can join the apostle John in saying, "Even so, come, Lord Jesus" (Revelation 22:20). Are you ready?

SUNDAY CLASS STUDY

HOW TO BE A FRIEND OF GOD

Text: 1 Peter 2:9

Introduction: No matter the number, the world is divided into two categories - the unique and the rest. The former are very few, while the rest are a sea of multitudes. As Christians, we must be unique because it is our creation, destiny, and purpose. In order to fulfill this destiny, we must maintain some attitudes. This is the bases of today's study. What are then the attitudes of unique people?

1. Unique people are proactive (Matt 5:16)
- To be proactive is to create or control a situation rather than respond to it after it has happened. They control the narrative, make things happen and help others decide on issues they control. Proactive people are seen as leaders wherever they are and make sure things are in order. This is the plan of God for you so that you can do the work of populating the kingdom of God. Henceforth, it would be best to balance the art of moving to the forefront. Be a good influence and a mover of good ideas. Don't be the multitude in life, Be a major player.

2. Unique people are confident (Heb 13:6) - Being confident is not being proud. They are two separate things, but you need to know their differences. Confidence is

being bold, learning to take responsibility, and standing out. (Acts 4:29) Understanding what it means to be a leader, go for it and make things happen (Phil 4:13). No matter what you lose in life, never lose your confidence because it makes you who you are. Don't allow fear of tomorrow, of making mistakes, the seen and unseen, to take away your confidence; if you can do this, your uniqueness will be visible to all eyes.

3. Unique people are humble (Luke 9:48) - One fact remains that humility is the fuel of greatness. It helps us from being overconfident because overconfidence leads to pride. Even in leadership, humility drives success. A spirit of humility attracts people to you; if this happens, you will see clearly that there are unique people and others are the rest.

Monday's Path: Titus 3:7 that having been justified by His grace we should become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

Pathway: There are lots of speculations about the topic of eternal life. People hold to a variety of theories and beliefs. Some think there is an afterlife of some kind, but 10% believe there is no form of life after we die. One-fourth of people admit they have no idea what will happen after death. Are you confident about your eternal destination? Are you sure you will spend eternity with God? Do you have doubts? You can be confident if you trust Him.

*O Lord, help me to have an assurance of my eternal home in Jesus' name; PRAY!

Tuesday's Path: Mark 2:10 "But that you may know that the Son of Man has power on earth to forgive sins" --He said to the paralytic,

Pathway: The paralyzed man needed to be healed. Yet before addressing his physical problems, Jesus first forgave his sins. To the scribes in the room, this was blasphemy! Jesus was demonstrating the connection between the physical and emotional parts of our lives. Today, doctors can confirm this connection. For the sake of our health and our testimony, we need to seek forgiveness in our relationship with God. We are promised that if we confess our sins, He will forgive and cleanse us

*O Lord, forgive me of every sin that will separate me from you this year in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Wednesday's Path: 1 Sam 7:2 So it was that the ark remained in Kirjath Jearim a long time; it was there twenty years. And all the house of Israel lamented after the LORD.

Pathway: The ark had been captured, and the Israelites lamented this loss. Yet, for a long time, they did nothing, finally acting after an amazing 20 years! From the message delivered through Samuel, it was clear they were guilty of compromise. Samuel promised God would deliver them, but only if they returned to Him "with all [their] heart." The Israelites agreed, but it took years to become willing to change.

*O Lord, deliver me from procrastination in Jesus' name.

PRAY!

Thursday's Path: 2 Sam 22:3 The God of my strength, in whom I will trust; My shield and the horn of my salvation, My stronghold and my refuge; My Savior, You save me from violence.

Pathway: There is this story about a brother and sister. They were caught in a narrow railroad tunnel through a mountain as two trains were about to meet. The girl hastily guided her brother to an indentation in the wall and cried out, "Keep close to the rock." The trains rushed by, and the children were unharmed. This story describes how we might be threatened with many kinds of danger but can be safe by trusting Jesus.

*O Lord, I rely on you for protection this year in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Friday's Path: John 8:12 Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the Light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the Light of life."

Pathway: Jesus still is the "light of the world." As the Bible confirms, He wants to be your Light. He can reveal more of His truths and change your life. He can give you more of His wisdom and power. Don't be content with a second-hand experience. Get to know Him more intimately.

*O Lord, help me to know you better in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Saturday's Path: Acts 17:24 "God, who made the world and everything in it, since He is Lord of heaven and earth, does not dwell in temples made with hands.

Pathway: This Saturday, remember, you can have a personal relationship with Jesus. Spend time with Him. Read God's Word. Ask Him to speak to you, guide you, and reveal more of Himself to you. Our God is not a seen God, and He wants us to serve Him in spirit and in truth. This is the hallmark of His children and His beloved.

*O Lord, help me get closer to you in Jesus' name.
