SUNDAY CLASS STUDY

A GRATEFUL HEART

Text: Psalm 116:12-14

Introduction: Being grateful to God is a good calling and one of the best ways to live one's life for God. As a creation, we must master the art of gratitude, especially to God if we want to live our lives to the fullest. Remember, a grateful heart is a healthy heart, and a healthy heart attracts wealth. When we constantly see everything positively, we will appreciate God more which inspires God to do more for us. However, if we love to complain, murmur, or focus our attention on what God has not done rather than what He has done, the result is always bad.

A. A positive question asked (v12) – The focus of the Psalmist here is to ask a positive question always. He wanted to know what he should do, to appreciate God on what he has benefitted from God. He had other options, like asking God why him, or why He has not done some other things. However, the Psalmist asked a positive question on how best he can appreciate God on what He has done. This attitude attracts more benefits from God.

1. "I will take up the cup of salvation" v13a (Participating) - Taking up the cup is joining others to celebrate, like raising a glass with others. To appreciate God, one important thing to do is to join other people of God to

celebrate the salvation given to us freely by Jesus Christ. By so doing, you are acknowledging the saving power of God to others who are still blinded by worldliness and sin.

2. "And call upon the name of the LORD" v13b (Depending) – You constantly pay back to God for all He has done when you depend on Him always and believing Him to be able to do it again. The reason why this is so, is because, you are making others know that He has done it before, and, He can still do it again. This is an important element of faith.

3. "I will pay my vows to the LORD, now in the presence of all His people" v14 (Broadcasting) – Unfortunately, most Christians did not know that it is not enough to thank God, pay vows, and appreciate God secretly. When you do that, it is not to anyone's benefit. However, when you give thanks to God openly, pay your vows before God's people, and give your testimony to others, you are not only inviting others to glorify God with you, but you are also showing your appreciation to God by lifting the souls of others to believing in God more.

DEVOTION TODAY With Pastor Christie



Monday's Path: Rom. 8:31 What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?

Pathway: We face many kinds of adversaries, rivals, and opposition. We face emotional and physical confrontations, stress and pressure, and competition for jobs, awards, or prizes. The political world is full of rivalries battling through elections and campaign ads. Communities and nations often find themselves in adversarial relationships. But the most important opposition we have is spiritual. As the Bible confirms, Satan and his demonic forces oppose us in any way they can. But our lives change when we focus on God and realize He is greater than any adversary we face.

*O Lord, I thank You for being greater than any opposition I face in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Tuesday's Path: Rom. 10:8 But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim);

Pathway: Even mature Christians can find themselves depending on their reputations and experiences, relationships and abilities, and position or status. But Paul taught that before God, none of these things matter. He made it clear: We are not saved because of anything we do or justified because of our works. The key is faith alone. We will need to speak the word of faith at some point and declare that Jesus is Lord! We will also need wisdom or guidance, deliverance or healing, discernment or salvation at other moments. God has a word of faith in each situation.

*O Lord, I have faith in You. I trust You for my needs (mention) Jesus' name. PRAY!

Wednesday's Path: Rom. 10:12 For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him.

Pathway: Paul wanted the Romans to understand that God abounds in riches! This means He does not lack anything! He has an abundance of everything! What kinds of riches? These are spiritual riches. But there is more! He is ready to meet all our financial, emotional, mental, and practical needs, even for ideas and wisdom. And He is not

stingy with these riches.

*O Lord, I will sow into Your Kingdom with my time, treasures, and talents. Bless me in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Thursday's Path: Rom. 11:36 For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen.

Pathway: Paul seemed to pause deep into his letter to the Romans. Having detailed so many insights about the Gospel, he appeared to have reached the end of his vocabulary. Amazed by what he had learned about God, he expressed being overwhelmed with explaining these insights. God does not owe anyone anything. He already has everything. He can create more of anything at any time. How would you describe what you know about God?

*O Lord, I commit to serving You in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Friday's Path: Rom. 12:11 Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord.

Pathway: God looks for those with this kind of total commitment. Remember, you owe everything to Him. He has given you opportunities to serve Him. Commit your life to Him. Believe Him to do remarkable things through you and in you. However, let your zeal always be burning.

*O Lord, let my life be consecrated to You. Use my hands, feet, words, and resources in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Saturday's Path: Rom. 12:6 Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith;

Pathway: Each person is unique in God's sight. We have been given "the ability to do certain things well." Only some things, just some specific things. This doesn't make anyone superior or inferior. We simply are all different. Do you want to feel fulfilled and experience all that God has prepared for you? Ask Him to help you employ the abilities, gifts, and talents He has given you.

*O Lord, Show me how I can use my abilities for Your Kingdom and glory in Jesus' name.
