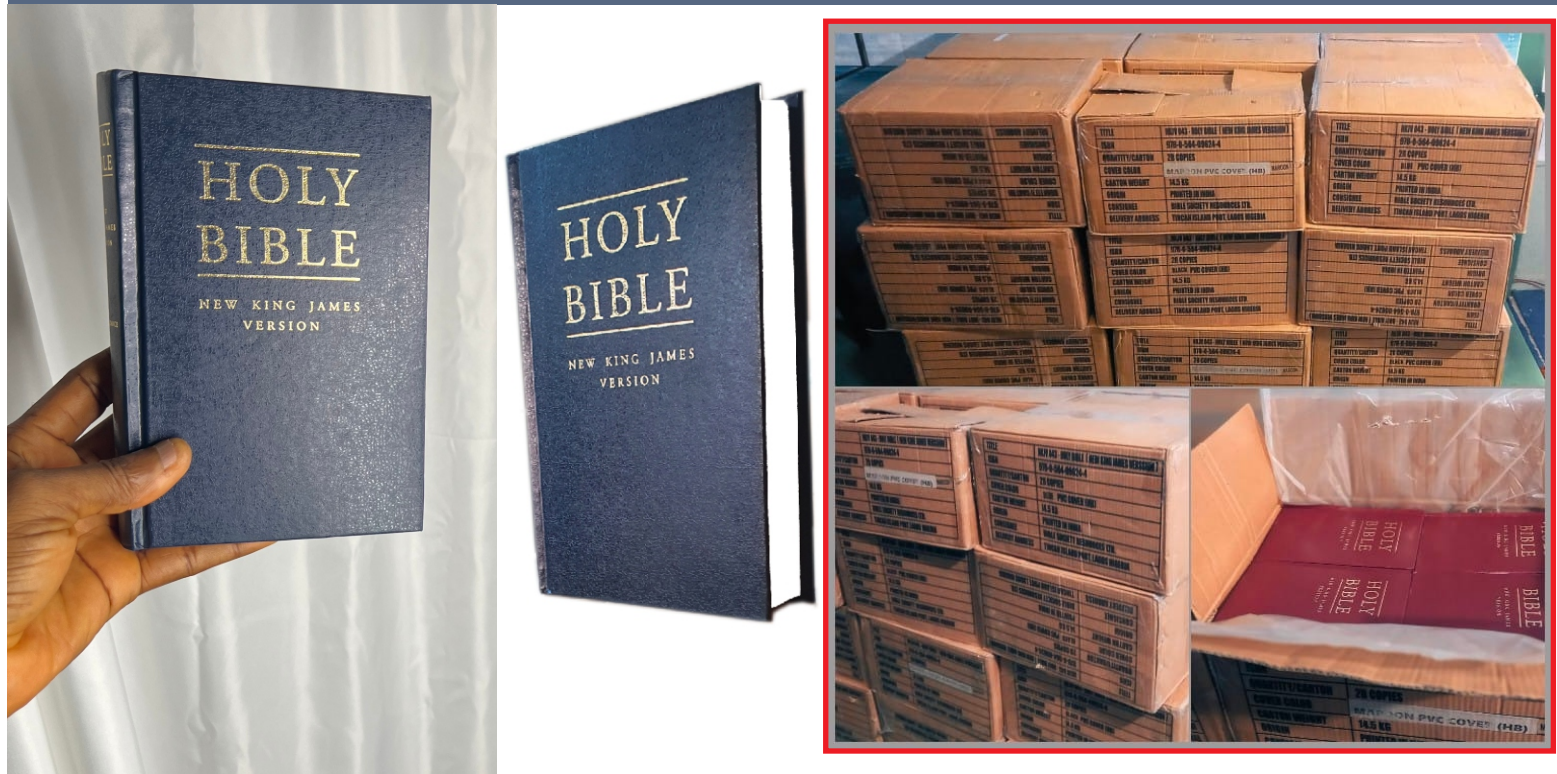

The RETURN OF CHRIST



In Matthew 24-25, Jesus addressed two important events: the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem (24:4-35) and His return (24:36-25:46). The Lord presented all of this information because He wanted His followers to be prepared for these great events.

The temple was destroyed in 70 AD when the Romans ransacked Jerusalem, just as Jesus had taught. However, the time of the Lord's return is unknown to man (24:36). Consequently, He repeatedly warned His followers to get prepared and to stay prepared (24:42, 44; 25:13).

As Jesus concluded His discussion of His return (25:31-46), He indicated that a separation will occur. He began by saying: "When the Son of man shall come in His glory, and all the holy angels with Him, then shall He sit upon the throne of His glory: and before Him shall be gathered all nations: and He shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divideth his sheep from the goats: and He shall set the sheep on His right hand, but the goats on the left"

(vs.31-33).

Those on the Lord's right hand will receive a great reward described as "life eternal" (vs.34-40, 46b). They will have ministered to the Lord through the service they offered to others in need: "Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me" (vs.40).

Those on the Lord's left hand will be punished with "everlasting punishment" (vs.41-45, 46a). They will have failed to minister to the Lord by failing to serve others: "Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye did it not to one of the least of these, ye did it not to me" (vs.45).

To be prepared for the Lord's return we must obey the Gospel (Mark 16:16), and we must remain faithful to Him (Revelation 2:10). He wants us to use the blessings, talents, and abilities that He provides. He also wants us to minister to Him by taking advantage of opportunities to serve others. Are you ready for the Lord's return?

SUNDAY CLASS STUDY

WHAT MAKES A TRUE LEADER

Introduction: It was established in the first part of this study that for our Church to thrive, we need to have true leaders. Leaders that understand what it takes to lead, who are ready to serve and not boss around, who are prepared to show leadership by example life. In today's study, emphasis will be given to what a true leader needs to do to be certified as a true leader.

1. True leaders will get involved (Eccl 9:10) - Some people nurse the ambition to lead and take leadership positions, but their flaw is that they wait until they are appointed to lead. This is not a good sign because if such people eventually find themselves in a position to lead, they will fail because they will see the leadership position as a place to give orders and demand respect. However, the first step to becoming a true leader is getting involved in any way possible. Be the organizer and not the organized. When you do, you will be seen by all as a leader.

2. True leaders will get others involved (Luke 5:7) - There are those who serve and want to do everything. They tend to

make it difficult for others to get involved. The reason for this is that they see others as their competition, whereas getting others involved makes things progress easily. When leaders see others as co-laborers and not rivals, things will not only move smoothly, growth and progress will come naturally. Don't be a visitor in a place you belong to.

3. True leaders will always volunteer (Gal 6:10) - A true leader will always volunteer first whenever needed. One of their duties is to fill in the gaps when an area of work is lacking people. However, some leaders believe that the moment they become a leader, they must not involve in anything but to be served. In contrast, true leaders quickly identify the gaps and fill them in. What makes you a great leader is what you do among people, not the orders you give them.

Monday's Path: 1 Cor. 13:11 When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things.

Pathway: Along the path toward spiritual maturity, we reach important conclusions. First, when we realize how little we know and how much we need God, we are humbled. We see that we cannot succeed on our own but need to depend on the presence and power of the Spirit. We realize why we need to be people of prayer, constantly seeking God for direction, protection, and wisdom. That, brethren, is mature thinking.

*O Lord, help me to mature in my faith in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Tuesday's Path: 1 Cor. 14:3 But he who prophesies speaks edification and exhortation and comfort to men.

Pathway: Instead of thinking about ourselves first, Paul urged us to approach life from the context of the body of Christ. We are to remember that we all are part of the same body. We need each other. Seek to edify others and build up the body. You have been blessed, so you can be a blessing!

*O Lord, Help me be a blessing to others in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Wednesday's Path: 1 Cor. 15:33 Do not be deceived: "Evil company corrupts good habits."

Pathway: The Scripture reinforces the truth that the company we keep influences us. The Greek word, used for the only time in the Bible, suggests relationships. The warning was clear: Wrong relationships can corrupt us even if we have strong morals. You can be corrupted by the people you spend time with, the things you watch, the social media you read, and the music you listen to. Be careful. Be alert.

*O Lord, help me not be swayed by the corrupting influences in the world around me in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Thursday's Path: 1 Cor. 16:2 On the first day of the week let each one of you lay something aside, storing up as

he may prosper, that there be no collections when I come.

Pathway: The Bible makes it clear. Stewardship is essential to being a Christian. It demonstrates our commitment to God and proves our priorities. Giving to Him helps us remember that everything we have belongs to Him and that He needs to have the first place in our lives. Many Christians, even today, do not realize the importance of stewardship. Make sure you are in the habit of giving to God. As necessary, put aside resources so you can give.

*O Lord, Help me to plan and be faithful in supporting Your Kingdom in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Friday's Path: 1 Cor. 16:22 If anyone does not love the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be accursed. O Lord, come!

Pathway: Being in love with Jesus helps us develop the right priorities and changes our approach to life. Instead of being concerned with ourselves, we will seek to know and serve Him. We will want to be with Him, and we will desire His presence. Like Paul, we can say "Maranatha," a word that means Come, Lord Jesus.

*O Lord, I want to deepen my relationship with You in Jesus' name. PRAY!

Saturday's Path: Luke 24:49 Behold, I send the Promise of My Father upon you; but tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high."

Pathway: Today, that same power is available to you. Do not look at the circumstances you face in your own strength or depend on your own abilities. Instead, look to the Holy Spirit God has given you. He is the Spirit of miracle-working power. With Him, nothing is impossible. Nothing! Call on Him for the problems you face! Do not limit Him!

*O Lord, I ask You to help me with these problems in Jesus' name.
